Charging your electric vehicle: Everything you need to know!

There are numerous options for charging your electric vehicle. The most common and practical one is to charge at home. As simple as charging your mobile phone, home charging can be done from either the **120V outlet** that comes with the vehicle or, for a faster charge, through a **240V station**. The latter option is a little bit more expensive, but it ensures that your vehicle is fully charged each day. You should also know that **subsidies** are available for the purchase of home charging stations. On the road, you can charge your car through the **constantly expanding public charging network**. Quebec already has 6,000 public charging stations, including over 500 quick-charge stations!
